Granada

"At the foot of the Sierra Nevada mountains, between the rivers Darro and Genil, lies one of the most interesting cities in eastern Andalusia. As well as its impressive Al-Andalus heritage, there are Renaissance architectural gems and the most modern facilities, fit for the 21st century.

Granada has an unmistakably Moorish flavor, as it was the last city to be reconquered by the Catholic Monarchs in 1492. Gastronomy, craftwork and urban planning are influenced by its glorious past.

Fountains, viewpoints and "Cármenes", houses surrounded by typical gardens of this city, create unforgettable corners in the city. It is no surprise that one of its historic districts, Albaicín, is a World Heritage Site, together with the Alhambra and Generalife. It was an important cultural center for many centuries, under both Islamic and Christian rulers, and still boasts an admirable array of culture and leisure activities.

DAY 2 - Sunday · September 24th



Ever since the Catholic Monarchs conquered Granada in 1492, the Alhambra, qa'lat al-Hamra, or the Red Castle, has fed the fantasies of travelers and visitors alike. And ever since the publication of Washington Irving's book, *Tales of the Alhambra*, the site's spectacular gardens, the sounds of its fountains, and its mysterious, sophisticated rooms have inspired travelers to imagine exotic scenes, transporting them to a fascinating world, far away in time and space.

The Alhambra, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984, is a truly singular place in Spain, representing more than 400 years of Islamic heritage, which affords it historical originality with respect to the rest of Europe. There's no other crossroads in the world as important as this Nasrid palace, no place as spellbindingly beautiful, where a sunset over its battlements alone makes the journey worthwhile.

During the tour we will also taste Granada's vibrant cuisine. Our local host will take you to some of the best establishments to try local "tapas", small bites full of history. In Granada, tapas are not just another way of eating, they are a way of life. Experience the city in all its glory: losing yourselves in its streets, exploring it with sight, as well as the palate.

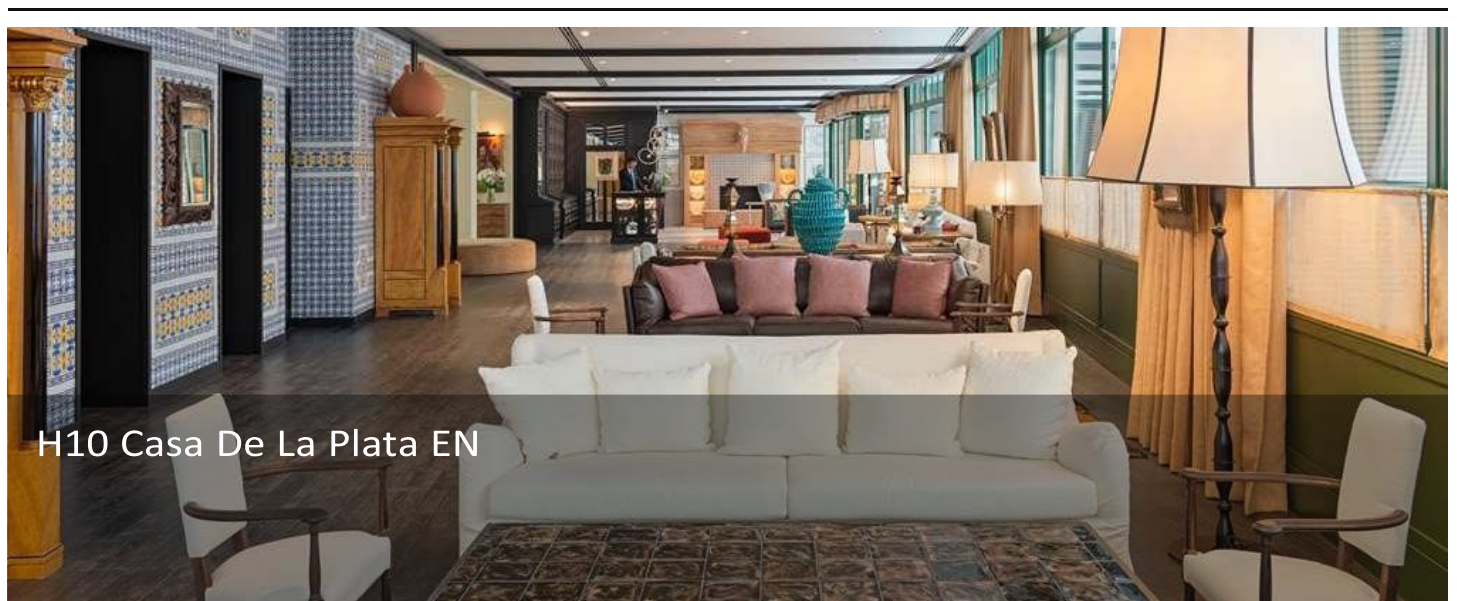


A relaxed, informal exploration of the Albaicín district, the one-time Moorish quarter of Granada and now a UNESCO World Heritage site. Your resident guide will show you how this medieval Islamic city has kept its identity into the modern age, explaining its social history and character in anecdotal style, and also answering your questions about current-day Spain.

As you walk through its cat's cradle of twisting alleyways you will come across stunning views of the city, the majestic Alhambra palaces, and the snow-capped mountains of the Sierra Nevada. You will pass by churches built on the sites of mosques, stroll underneath the walls of the scented gardens of carmenes, and stop in squares to take in the slow rhythms of daily life in this most traditional and yet singular neighborhood.

Sevilla

"Seville is a city that leaves its mark, and many people define it as special. It might be because of the grandeur of its monuments. Or perhaps the charm of areas such as Triana. It may possibly be the scent of jasmine in its squares or the Spanish guitar music of its streets. Some say that it's the tradition of its festivals, and many are convinced its tapas are the real reason.

You can see it for yourself in the few meters that separate the Giralda tower, the Cathedral and the Real Alcázar of Seville. La Giralda is a city icon and one of its main charms lies in its viewpoint. The views of Seville are fantastic with its courtyards of orange trees, typical in Andalusia, and a close-up of the largest Gothic temple in Europe, the Cathedral. A visit to the Real Alcázar reveals an extraordinary palace full of details. If you visit in the summer, take advantage of the night visits and the festival held in its gardens.

Seville is much more than its undeniable monumentality. It is a city of lively streets and large open spaces such as the huge Plaza de España, María Luisa Park, and the avant-garde Setas de Sevilla. And if you want to enjoy the authentic atmosphere of Seville, try going for tapas in the old town, in popular areas such as Alameda, Macarena, Nervión, Los Remedios or Triana. Marinated 'pescaito' (fish), small filled rolls, typical snails, fino (white wine), manzanilla (sweet wine) or a cold beer are a must on any tapas outing.

In Seville, tradition is always in fashion. From flamenco shows and Spanish guitar music to typical ceramics and crafts, which are always a good souvenir of the city. There are plenty of shops and workshops in Triana. And it's easy to enjoy flamenco at one of the many 'tablaos' or neighborhood 'peña' groups.

The tradition of Seville is also reflected in its more international festivals. Two good examples are the April Fair and Holy Week. The first is all about joy and passion for popular Andalusian art, an unbeatable chance to enjoy the sound of the Spanish guitar, flamenco fashion and festive Seville. Holy Week is a passionate festival full of emotional moments. To understand it, the best option is to witness one of the much-visited religious processions or hear a live 'saeta' (emotional flamenco song dedicated to the religious figures)."



The Cathedral of Seville is a must-see—everything in it is amazing. Its collection of over 600 paintings is of first-rate category, and its altarpiece is the largest in Christendom. It is also the world's largest Gothic building and has wonders like the astonishing Renaissance rooms, Chapter Hall or the Royal Chapel, a fabulous sculpture collection, and of course the "Giralda", the medieval Moorish tower. It was set out to amaze from the very beginning when its builders stated their clear intentions of "making a temple so large that in the coming centuries we will be deemed crazy".

Since the first mosque was erected under Moorish rule in the 12th century through the building of the first cathedral in the 15th century and its listing as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1987 alongside the Alcazar and the General Archive of the Indies, Seville's Cathedral has delighted locals and visitors for centuries.

Visit to an Iberian ham producer & tasting

If you are interested in food, then you have probably heard of Iberian or “ibérico” ham. When it is from free range animals that feed on acorns for the last 3 months of their lives, it is by far the best ham that can be found anywhere in the world. So, a tour that highlights this culinary delight is an experience not to be missed.

You will be taken to the Sierra of Aracena in the province of Huelva, one of the principal areas for Iberian ham production, 90 kilometers to the north-east of Seville. You will be visiting a producer in the small town of Corteconcepción. You’ll start by seeing how the pigs are raised and get to take a walk amongst the oak trees that provide the precious acorns. You’ll then head to the installations where the hams are cured and learn about all the steps that are needed to produce Iberian ham and other cured products. Of course, the visit would not be complete without a tasting and you will have the chance to compare non-acorn fed and acorn fed Iberian ham. You will also taste some cured loin. Wines from Huelva will accompany the tasting. It is then off to the town of Aracena to a restaurant your guide has been going to for 28 years! You’ll get to sample some great local dishes including meat from the Iberian pig, accompanied by some great Spanish wine. After lunch, for those who would like to, they can walk up to the castle which offers beautiful views of the surrounding countryside. It’s then off to Tavira in Portugal.

It is just a few kilometers from the magnificent city of Évora, a UNESCO heritage site, between the contemporary architecture of the winery, a building entirely covered with cork, and the medieval palace of the Morgado de Oliveira family (14th century). This family-owned business produces a splendid Alentejan wine.

The winery started off in the early 2000s but the palace in their estates is of the 14th century. It has the perfect blend of culture and modernization. Over time, their palace has undergone changes that gives them flexibility in modern ways but at the same time also preserve their traditional touches. The culture is deeply rooted here, and their wines reflect the character of their culture and their region.

The origins of the Convento do Espinheiro are connected to a legend that tells of an apparition of the Virgin Mary above a thornbush (= espinheiro) around the year 1400. In 1412, a oratory was built in honour of Our Lady and finally in 1458, during the reign of King Afonso V, and due to increasing pilgrimage, a church and convent were built and settled by monks of the Order of St. Jerónimo.

Whilst making a general appreciation of the presence of the Convento do Espinheiro in the history of Portugal, one can say, not without a touch of emotion, that these stones were once witness to the passage of many illustrious figures. Kings, queens, great men and great ladies of the court, due to their devotion and generosity, contributed to the magnificence of this convent which will always be indissolubly connected to the life of the Court.

Evora is a city located in the heart of the Portuguese Alentejo.

DAY 7 - Friday · September 29th



Overlooking the Alentejan plains and with its Iberian and Roman roots, Évora is currently a living museum.

Home of ancient Portuguese kings, the great beauty of its corners and its fascinating history make it a destination well worth the trip. The whitewashed façades of its old houses, the marble fountain in the centric Giraldo square, its cobbled narrow streets, the vestiges of the old wall, the Cathedral or Diana's Temple, the remains of its old Jewish quarter or São Francisco church are examples of the wonderful historic heritage of the city. In addition, in Évora we can also taste mouthwatering Alentejan traditional convent sweets.

Throughout our exploration of this marvelous town, we can also see in its streets, churches and corners, the traditional Portuguese tile. In many cases, the processes of this recognizable and delicate craft haven't changed since the 16th century.

Welcome to Cascais



"Situated close to the sea and traditionally a fishing village, Cascais enjoyed an important period of development in the 14th century, when it was a major stopping-off point for boats on their way to Lisbon, turning it into a very busy port at that time.

It was, however, in the second half of the 19th century, when sea bathing became a popular activity, that Cascais was given the impetus that transformed it into a very fashionable summer resort. The great driving force behind this transformation was the king of Portugal, Dom Luís I, who, in 1870, converted the Fortaleza da Cidadela into the summer residence of the Portuguese monarchy. The king's example was immediately copied by the nobility, who built palaces and extremely beautiful villas in the town, where they spent the hottest season of the year, completely transforming the appearance of the former fishing village.

Cascais also began to attract the attention of the curious, who came here to enjoy a stroll by the seaside, and access to the town was greatly facilitated by the opening of the railway line between Pedrouços and Cascais in 1889. Nowadays, Cascais is a very lively and cosmopolitan town that still preserves a great deal of its earlier aristocratic atmosphere.

Particularly recommended is a stroll through its streets, where you will find shops of the highest quality, or perhaps you might prefer to enjoy a few moments' rest at one of the many outdoor cafés and restaurants scattered about the town. The beaches continue to be one of Cascais' greatest attractions, and it is possible to choose from amongst those that are situated in the town's sheltered bay or those a little further away in the area around Guincho, (already forming part of the Sintra-Cascais Natural Park), where there are excellent conditions for surfing and windsurfing. The Boca do Inferno (literally the Jaws of Hell), an inlet along the coast that is surrounded by steep rocks and caves, continues to be a natural curiosity attracting many thousands of visitors to marvel at the brute strength of the sea.

A special mention is reserved for the local cuisine, especially the fresh fish and shellfish dishes that are served here and which can be enjoyed in the region's many restaurants."

DAY 8 - Saturday · September 30th



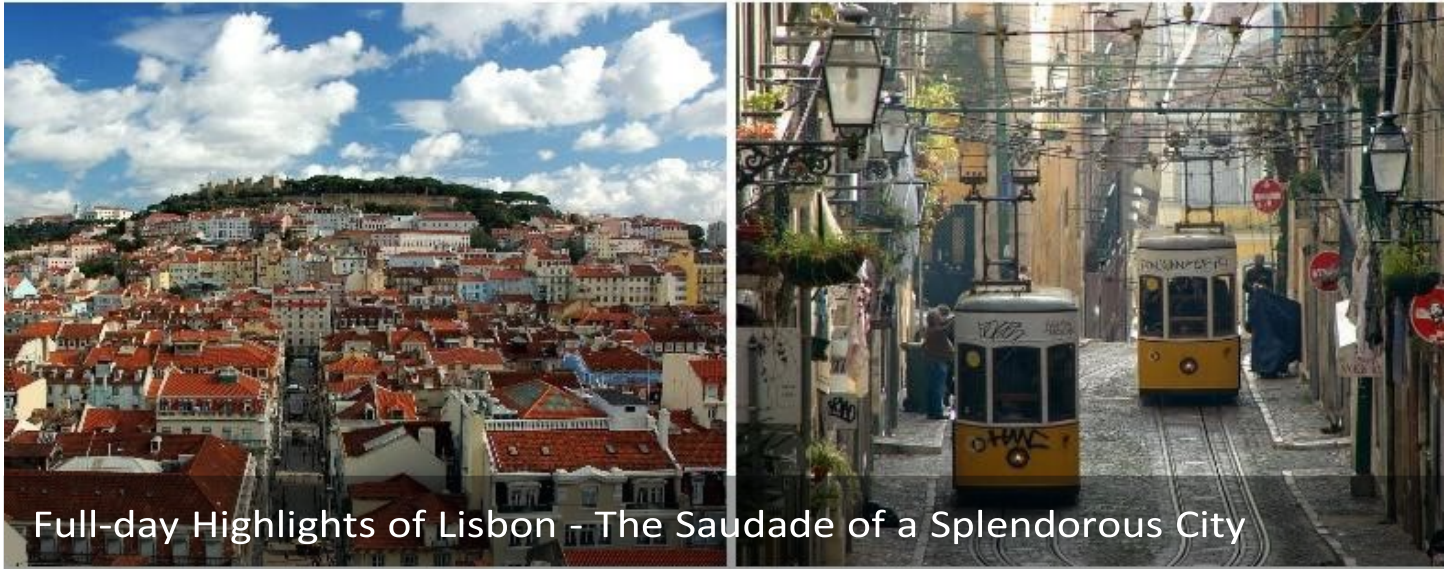
A beautiful town at the foot of the mountain range of the same name, its unique characteristics have led UNESCO to classify it as a World heritage site. It was even necessary to create a special category for the purpose - that of "cultural landscape" - taking into account its natural riches as well as the historic buildings in the town and mountains. Endowed with luxuriant vegetation, the mountains are part of the Sintra-Cascais Natural Park.

The palaces, too, are outstanding, such as the Pena Palace, built in the Romantic period on one of the mountain peaks, and the 18th century Palace of Seteais, now converted into an elegant hotel, and the Palace of Monserrate, famous for its beautiful gardens with their exotic species that are unique in the country.

Near Sintra are the beaches (das Maças, Praia Grande, Praia da Adraga), Cabo da Roca (the westernmost point of mainland Europe), Colares (after which a demarcated wine-growing region is named), and the picturesque village of Azenhas do Mar, inset in a cliff.

DAY 9 - Sunday · October 1st



Lisbon is bathed in light. There you will taste many different traditional “petiscos” (small dishes) and wine, whilst you listen to two singers accompanied by guitar players, showcasing the best Fado music.

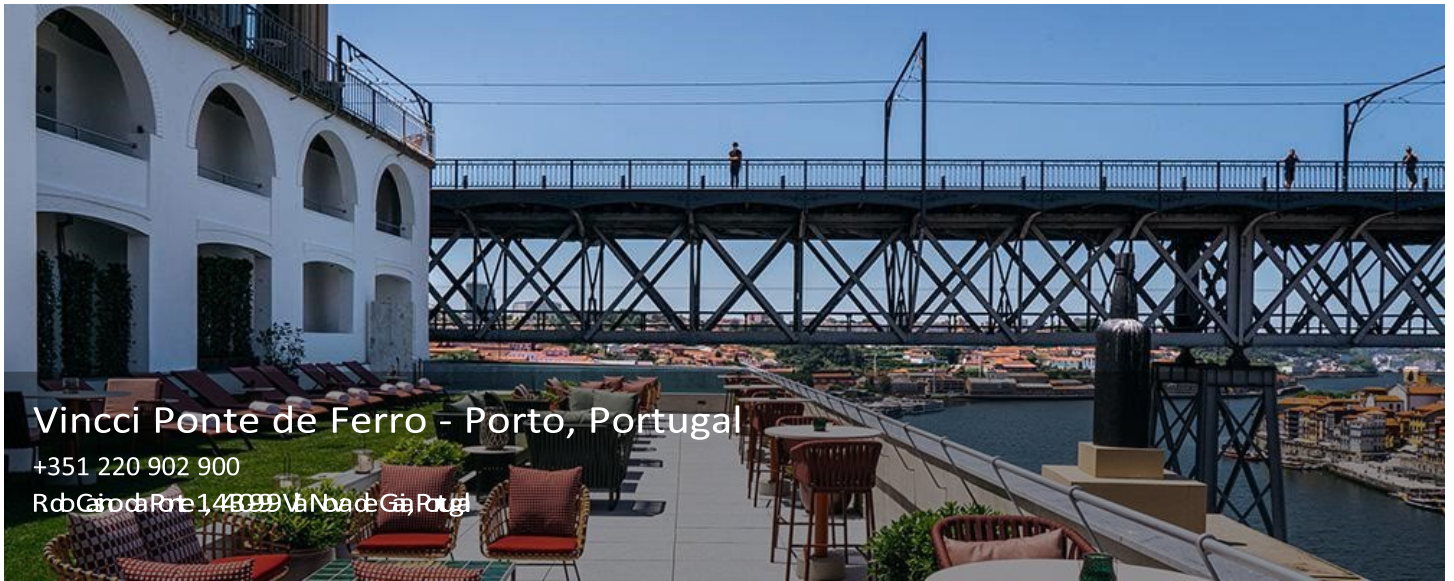
